During periods of school closure, government guidance confirms that effective remote education plans should be in place. These should ensure that procedures are in place for the school to continue to deliver its planned curriculum.

Our Remote Education

Morley Meadow Primary has the capacity to offer immediate remote education using our preferred online platforms Class Dojo and Microsoft Teams.

We aim to:

- continue the curriculum sequence of learning linked to the school's curriculum expectations
- enable children to access to high-quality online and offline resources and teaching videos
- use consistent resources across the school in order to allow interaction, assessment and feedback
- provide printed resources, such as workbooks, for pupils who do not have suitable online access
- work with families to deliver a broad and ambitious curriculum for all pupils including those with SEND

When Teaching Pupils Remotely

We will:

- set activities that are meaningful and ambitious each day in a number of different subjects following the weekly timetable for the class
- teach a planned and well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- provide new content, delivered by a teacher through high quality curriculum resources and accompanied by videoed explanations linked to a PowerPoint presentation.
- set clear expectation on how regularly teachers will check work
- gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum, using questions and other suitable tasks
- enable teachers to adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding

Parents/Carers/Children will:

- use Class Dojo to access remote learning
- share learning, progress and communicate any misconceptions through their child's Class Dojo portfolio or messaging service

• inform the school if they have difficulties accessing remote learning or where this places significant demands on parents' help or support.
