

# PE and School Sport Action Plan Morley Meadow Primary school 2023–2024

**Background -** The primary school sport premium investment goes direct to primary school Head Teachers and is designed to support improvements in the quality and depth of PE and school sport.

**Key Indicators -** The Department for Education vision is that all pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The objective is to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport that delivers high quality provision of a balanced and holistic PE and school sport offer. There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 2. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- 3. The profile of PE and school sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

**Funding -** Individual schools will receive circa £16K –17K per annum (depending on the number of pupils) which they can use to support these outcomes through various options including; release of staff for CPD, employing specialists to work alongside teachers, cluster work with other schools and partnerships, transport, equipment, hall and pool hire etc.

- PE lead to attend PE Subject Leadership award.
- Introducing Alternative Sports Day and Beach Day.
- Introduce Playground leaders.
- Healthy movers and Health and Wellbeing day.
- First Aid training for children.
- Investigate the investment in a Actival Wall.
