We will learn to:

- re-read what we have written to check that it makes sense.
- read a few common exception words
- form lower-case and capital letters correctly
- understand the story of The Three Little Pigs
- listen to different versions of The Three Little Pigs



Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

We will learn to:

- keep trying even when things are difficult
- respond with appropriate emotions in a range of situations
- understand what factors contribute to my health and wellbeing



Physical Development:

We will learn to:

- have a strong core
- demonstrate coordination, balance and agility
- use a range of tools confidently and safely
- combine different movements together e.g. run and jump
- throw and kick a ball
- form most letters correctly
- sit on the floor or table with a good posture



PSHE (Jigsaw):

We will learn to:

- understand why exercise and why it is good for us
- understand why movement and rest are important
- understand what foods healthy and which ones are not so healthy
- understand why sleep is good for our health
- understand the importance of hand washing
- know who our safe adults are
- how to stay safe



Mathematics

We will learn to:

- use mathematical language to describe 2 groups of objects
- recognise 'more' and 'fewer'
- use the statement '5 and a bit' to talk about numbers to 10
- recognise the '1 more' pattern
- order numbers to 10 with some help
- identify the parts of a whole set by subitising
- know when 2 groups are equal
- use my fingers to represent doubles
- say what the whole is when there are 2 equal parts
- talk about the attributes of different objects
- I know that numbers are made up of other numbers

How I can help my child this term:

- share books at home every day with your child
- talk about the books that you share and explore new and interesting words
- sing counting songs and rhymes
- practice writing your child's name using lower case letters and a capital letter at the start

Communication and Language:

We will learn to:

- understand and respond to questions
- be curious to know more and can ask questions
- talk about our thinking using clear and well-structured spoken language
- use relevant detail to talk about events



Understanding of the World:

We will learn to:

- name and describe people who are familiar to us
- comment on images of familiar situations in the past
- compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past
- recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways
- draw information from a simple map
- understand that some places are special to members of our community
- explore the natural world around us
- describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside
- understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around us



Wild Tribe:

We will learn to:

- work as a team
- keep trying, even when things are challenging
- make bird feeders
- notice and talk about different textures



Expressive Art and Design:

We will learn to:

- return to and build on our previous learning, refining ideas and developing our ability to represent them
- develop storylines in our pretend play
- explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups
