### Re: Remote Learning & Education Strategy

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your support following the Government's announcement last night and like you, we only found out about the closure of schools to all accept vulnerable and key workers during this briefing. We were disappointed to not to be welcoming the children back.

Today, we have been finalising our plans to ensure our Remote Learning strategy is in place to support your children (and you) with continuing their education through this term as we are committed to providing them with the breadth of curriculum and learning opportunities they deserve.

#### We aim to:

- continue the curriculum sequence of learning at home linked to the school's normal curriculum expectations.
- enable children to access high-quality online and offline resources and teaching videos.
- use consistent resources across the school and year groups, in order to allow interaction, assessment and feedback.

Below is an overview of the online teaching resources we will use to support the delivery of daily teaching.

- All home learning materials will be shared via the Class Dojo platform or Tapestry in Foundation (Willow Class)
- Teaching staff will post home learning activities onto their Class Dojo/Tapestry page by 8.45am each day during the period of closure. This will include a clear summary of the daily expectations, PowerPoint presentations with video input from the class teacher and links to prepared resources and activities.
- Teachers will be available for a point of contact for parents and carers between the normal school working hours (8.45am – 3.20pm). Staff will be able to provide support for children and parents about how to access and complete tasks and respond to any work submitted for review.
- Children and parents (for our younger children) are strongly encouraged to submit work via
  their portfolio in Class Dojo/Tapestry daily so teaching staff are able to respond to the
  children's learning to praise and support any misunderstanding providing further support
  as required. This is a really important tool in enabling us to assess the progress of your
  children and continue their learning journey following the progress they have made since
  returning to school.
- Class teacher's will contact parents/children through their Class Dojo Portfolio if their child requires learning tailored to their specific need/ability.









• Parents/carers are able to contact teachers through Class Dojo to request any logins and passwords for learning platforms, problems accessing home learning resources etc.
